KEY POINTS FOR POLICIES, PROCEDURES, AND SPIRITUAL REQUIREMENTS

CHURCH, FACULTY, STUDENT RELATIONSHIP: Zion Hill Missionary Baptist Church of Batesville, AR. directs the policies and ministry of BBI. BBI is responsible to Zion Hill MBC at all times. Great care is taken for the closest fellowship between church, faculty, and students. However, students and faculty members of another or coming from another sister church will not seek to shape the policy of the seminary nor direct and influence the business of said sponsoring church.

EDUCATION FOCUSED ON SERVICE: ABA Students must be active in the church of their membership as a means of worship, service, and spiritual development. Special attention and honor are to be given by all students to special services and events at BBI, such as the Annual Rally and Graduation or any other event.

CHAPEL: Attending Chapel lectures is an integral part of seminary training and all students and faculty on campus at the time of Chapel are required to attend, unless excusable by president or dean for justifiable reasons. Each student is given one (1) credit hour per semester for chapel. Chapel service times vary from year to year.

CODE OF CONDUCT: BBI will not except no less standard for conduct than that of Scripture: 1 Corinthians 10:31-33, Colossians 3:12-17, Matthew 5:3-9, 48, and 2 Timothy 2:14-16 are expressions of the standard of conduct which all ought to continually strive towards. Some specifics are:

1. Anyone conducting themselves unworthily or unbecoming as a Christian may be asked to withdraw from the school.
2. Profanity and possession or use of intoxicants or illegal drugs is absolutely prohibited.
3. All instructors will be respected for their positions, and students will not be permitted to vie one instructor against another. The faculty members adhere to the principal of unity in the cardinal tenets of the ABA Articles of Faith with individual liberty in matters of interpretation. Students are urged to prove all things for themselves and to learn clearly what is taught by their instructors whether they choose to agree or disagree with their teachings.

DRESS CODE:

1. Minimum: Semi-Casual (khaki style pants, polo style shirts, loafer style shoes)
2. Forbidden: shorts, dresses and skirts above the knee, t-shirts, flipflops, athletic wear, tuckable shirts untucked.
3. Students must practice good hygiene.
4. Formal dress wear is required for faculty and students actively involved in Chapel services and special events.
